Genesee Community College Courses

Students should choose one major and complete as many recommended courses below as needed to fulfill program elective requirements. Students should complete coursework listed below. St. John Fisher requires students to take a minimum of one-half of the major courses at St. John Fisher. Please contact an admissions representative at Fisher for specific major requirements.

American Studies - BA	Choose up to six courses from the following with no more than two courses from each of the following three groupings: 1. ECO 101, 105; POS 101; 2. LIT 212, 216; 3. HIS 203, 204,
Biology – BA/BS	BIO 115, 116 CHE 101, 102 MAT 129
Chemistry - BA/BS	CHE 101, 102, 201, 202; MTH 141, 142, 245, 255; PHY 131 & 132.
Criminology - BA	CRJ 101, 113, 205, 209; SOC 101, 115, 210;
Economics – BA	ECO 101, 105; MAT 129
English – BA	Choose three courses from: LIT 212, 216, 217, 218; and one 200 level literature course.
History – BA	HIS 104, 105, 203, 204 and one additional HIS course from the following: HIS 107, 207, 211, 215, 217, 227
International Studies – BA	ECO 101; HIS 105; POS 106; language proficiency through the intermediate level in order to start at the 200 level at Fisher.
Legal Studies – BA	Recommended: POS 101, 203; PLG 114
Mathematics – BA/BS	MTH 141; 142, 245, 246, 247, 255, 290.
Media and Communication -BA	COM 101, 110, 111
Public Relations - BS	COM 101, BUS 106
Modern Language – BA	SPA 101, 102, 201, 202
Physics – BA Physics – BS	MTH 141, 142, 245, 255; PHY 131 & 132 MTH 141, 142, 245, 255; PHY 131 & 132; Choose one of the following sequences: BIO 115, 116/CHE 101, 102.
Political Science – BA	POS 101, 106, 203, 210.
Psychology – BA/BS	MAT 129; PSY 101, 106, 201, 202, 203, 204, 210, 211 or 250. One PHI and Natural Science course each.
Statistics – BA	MAT 129, 141, 142, 245, 246;
Sociology – BA	SOC 101, 102, 103, 115, 204, 210.

Recommended: Fulfill remainder of associate degree requirements. Choose courses from major listing to fulfill major elective requirements for your program of choice.

BA degree candidates need to show *language proficiency*. Students can fulfill the requirement by either having transfer credit for language at the 112 level at Fisher (102 level at GCC), taking course(s) at Fisher to complete at the 112 level or by taking a language proficiency test through the department of Modern Languages at Fisher that demonstrates proficiency at the 112 level. The proficiency test does not result in academic credit, as this is not a credit requirement. Transfer coursework will result in academic credit.

Grade Point Average: 2.0 GPA required for admission consideration to St. John Fisher. Student must submit formal transfer application available at <http://go.sjf.edu/transfer> the semester before intended enrollment.
